Subscribe to Open (S2O)

- S2O is a business model to convert entire volumes (years) of a journal to Open Access
 - It is applicable to all disciplines and to authors in all countries
- Under S2O, Institutional customers continue to subscribe to the journals that their patrons' value
- If support is sufficient, new articles are published OA under a Creative Commons license
 - If support is insufficient, the paywall is retained
- It is a subscription model, not a voluntary donation approach



The Benefits of S2O

- No APCs
- Entire journal volumes become Open Access
- Cost neutral for libraries, revenue stable for publishers
- Uses existing sales and procurement channels
- Expands readership and authorship globally
- Inclusive and fair

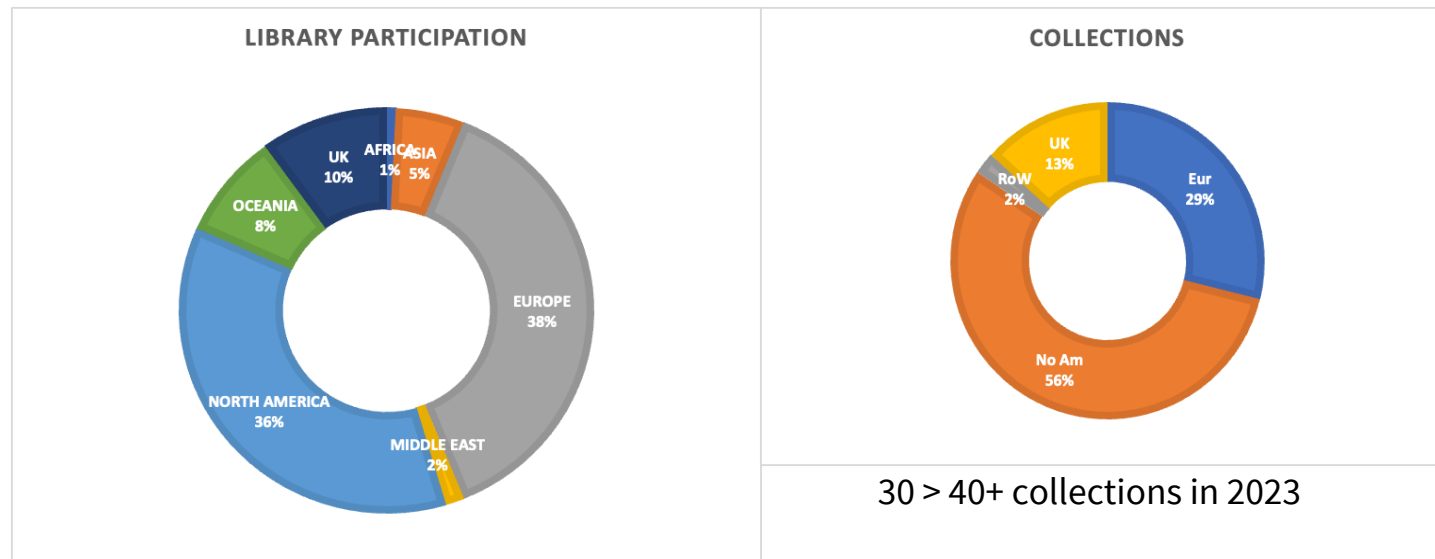


Subscribe to Open Community of Practice

- Established: August 2020
 - Meets monthly: 13 > over 100 participants
- Aims: to disseminate best practices for all stakeholders to adopt and implement the principles of S2O
 - Goal: to build consensus around S2O as a sustainable mechanism for delivering OA
- Participants: Librarians, Publishers, Funders, Subscription agents and other intermediaries
 - Membership is neutral and does not imply intent to implement the model, but an interest in discussing and learning about S2O

Berghahn Open Anthro

- Independent mission-driven scholarly press in the HSS
 - 2023 Publishing program: ~ 130 new books (~12 OA)
 - 41 journals: 21 OA (15 via S2O; 6 via Diamond)
- 15 anthropology titles open access in 2023 using S2O
 - Collection pricing: 3,000 EUR for 1 year / 7,950 EUR for 3 years
 - Single title pricing: ~ 245 EUR

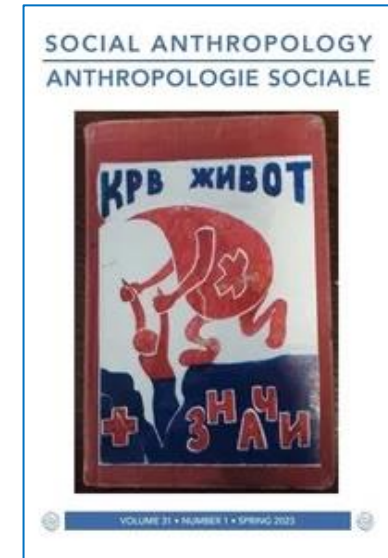
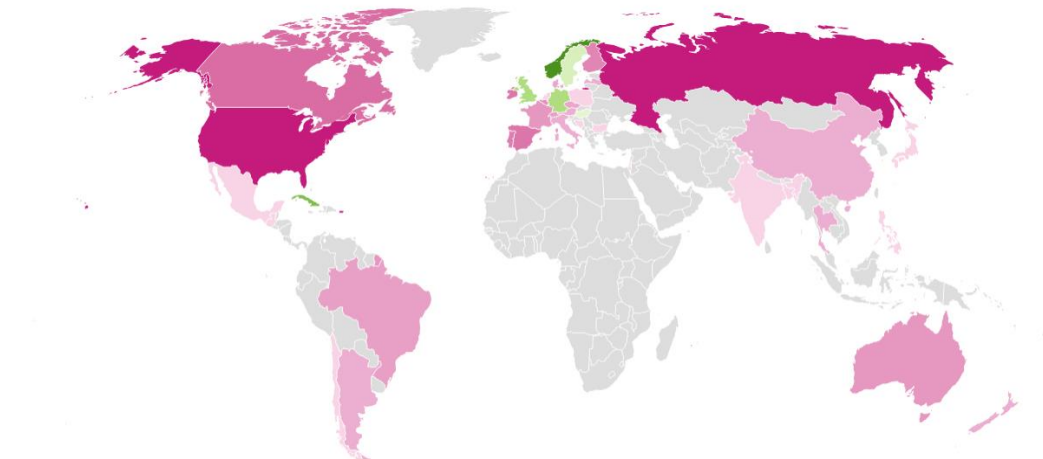
Transitioning to equitable open access



Members voted to make *Social Anthropology / Anthropologie Sociale* Open Access via S2O

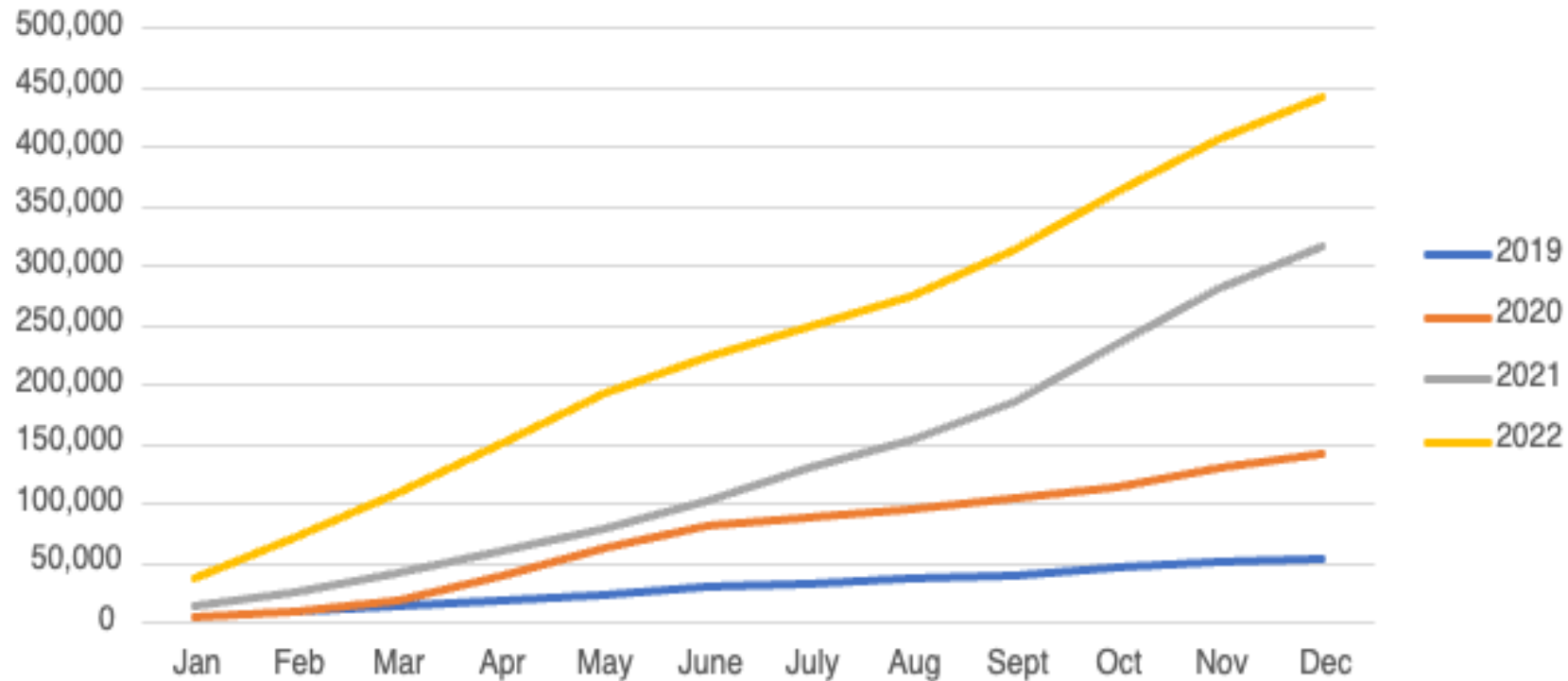
- Referendum: 90% voted “Yes”
- Community-led open access in action
 - A rejection of inequitable APC models

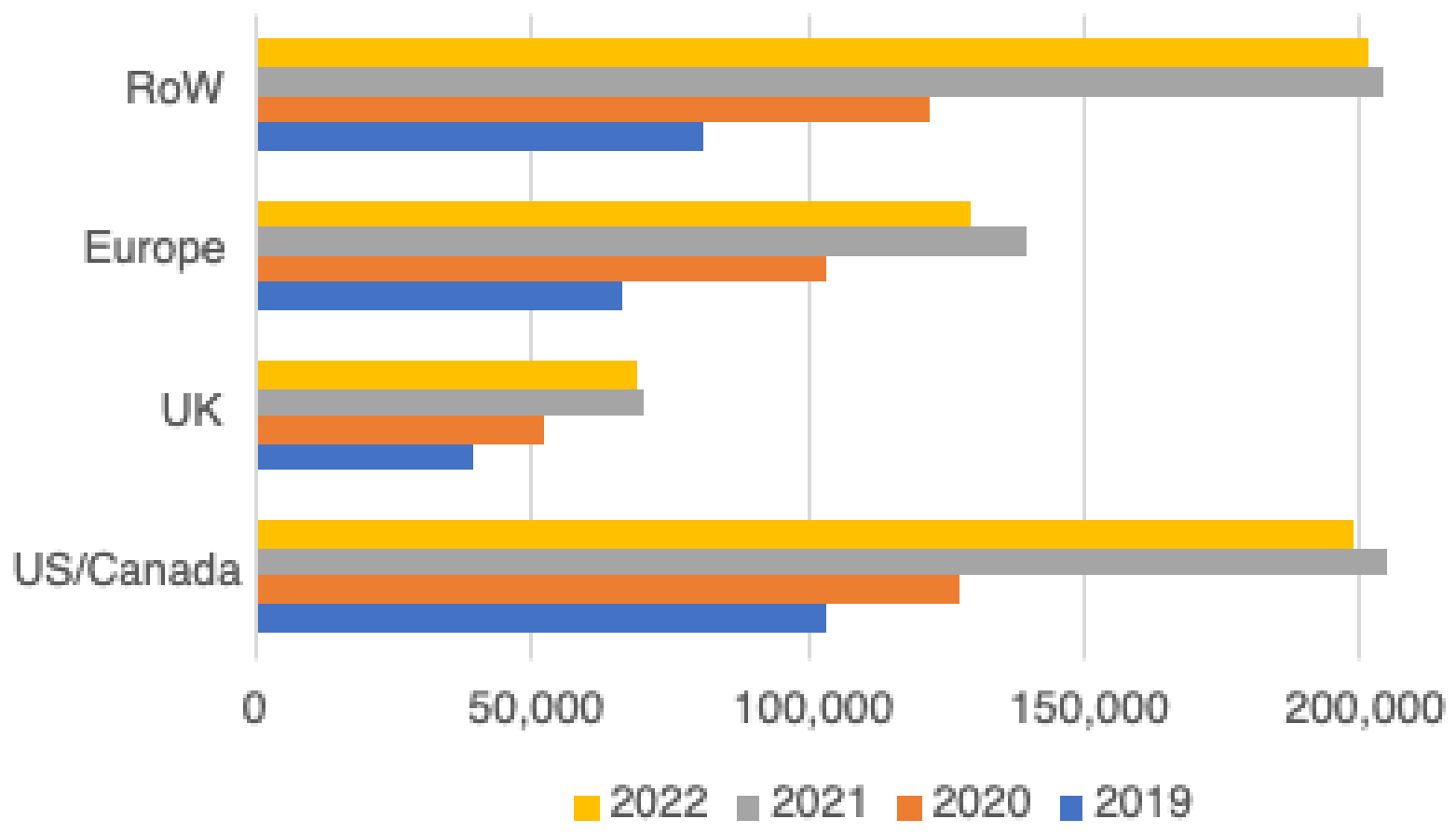
BOA: Closed vs Open Access Downloads

> 200% increase

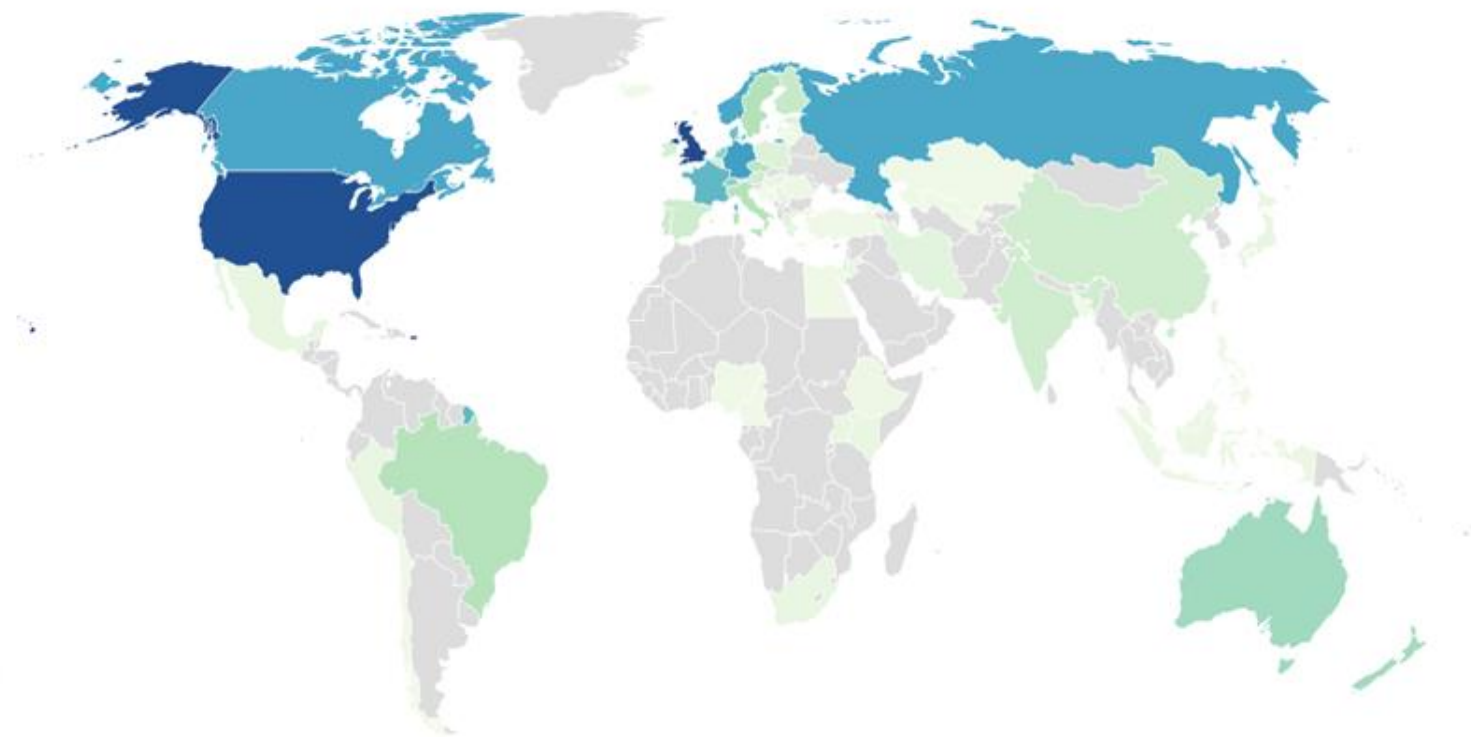
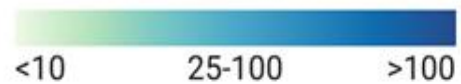
Readership by Region



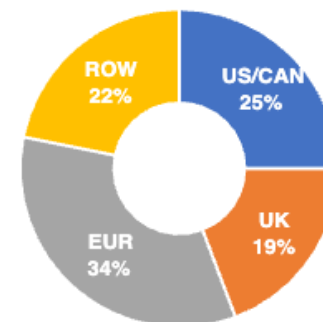

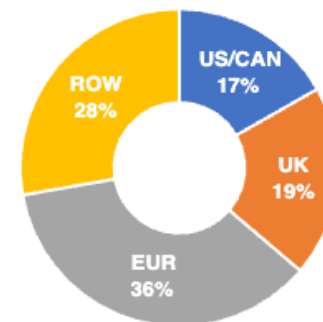

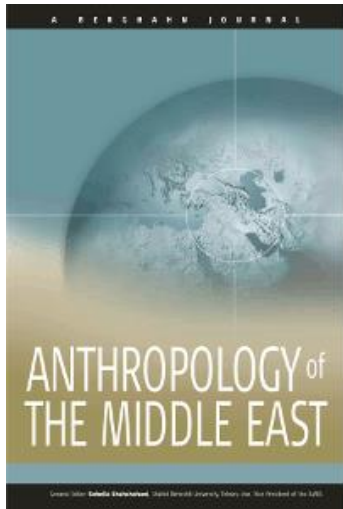
2019 Authors by Region



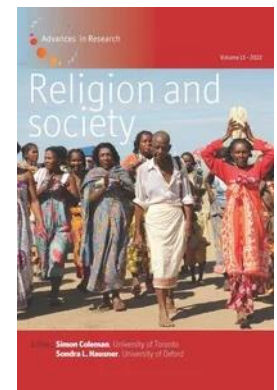
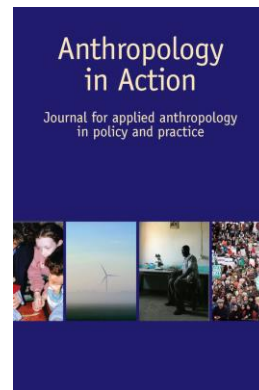
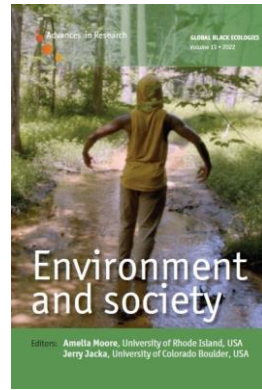
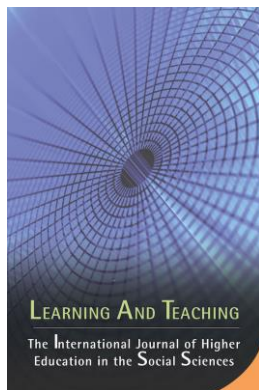
2022 Authors by Region

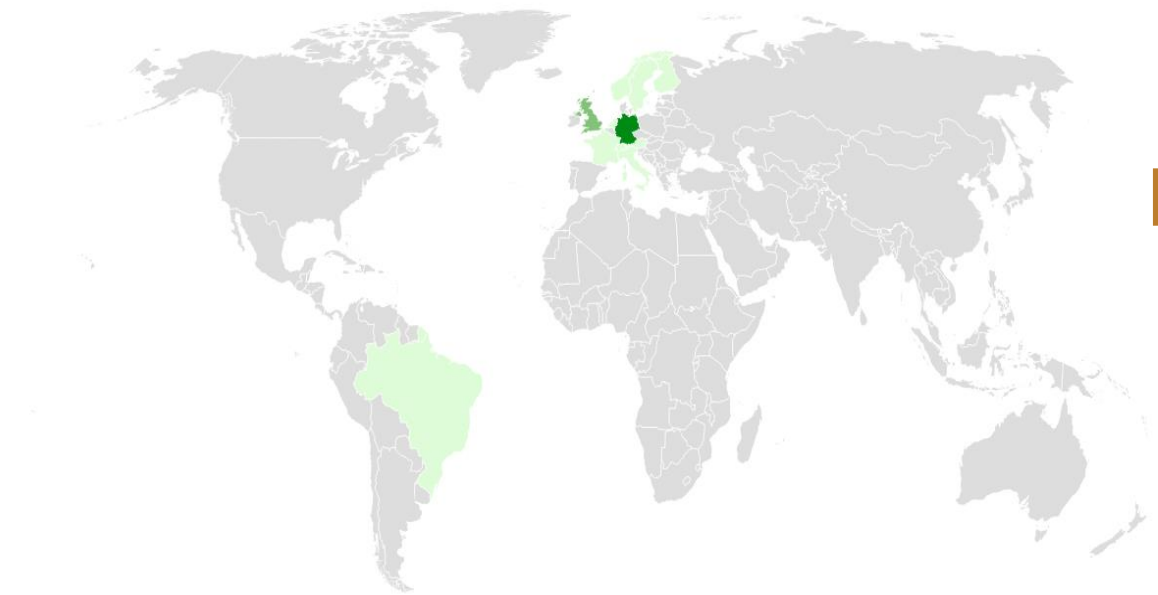


S2O Looking Ahead

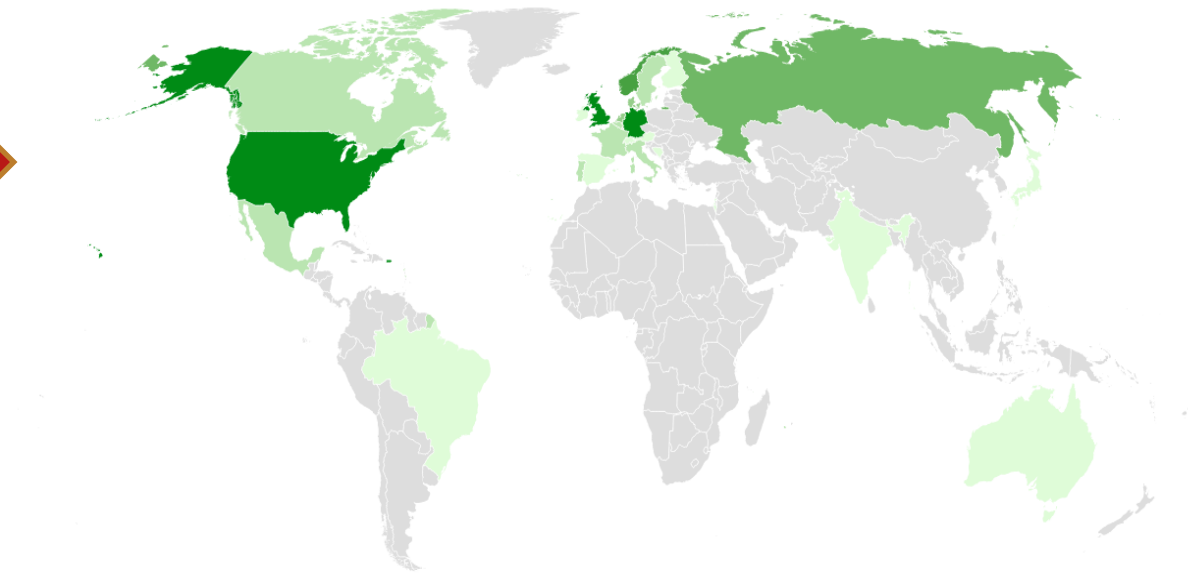
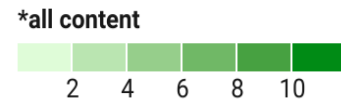
- Model continues to evolve
- More publishers adopting it, more libraries supporting it
- Future role of funders
 - cOAlition S endorsement of S2O (27/04/2021)
“Using existing budget and subscription processes without imposing paywalls, S2O provides a rapid route to open access that is applicable to research from all disciplines and all countries. cOAlition S encourages publishers to seriously consider the Subscribe to Open Model as a model for achieving full transformation to open access publishing and Plan S compliance.”
